

Library Books




All borrowed Library books that are at home and are overdue need to be returned to School as soon as possible.

Recipe of the week

Mini Banana & Blueberry Breads



2 Cups SR Flour, 1 Teaspoon Bi-carb Soda, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 cup caster sugar, 3/4 cup buttermilk, 1/4 cup vegetable oil, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 overripe banana mashed, 1 cup fresh blueberries or frozen blueberries, 1 extra sliced banana.

Pre-heat oven to 190 degrees. Grease mini loaf pan or muffin pan. Sift flour, carb soda and cinnamon in bowl, stir in sugar. Whisk buttermilk, oil, eggs, vanilla and mashed banana in bowl, add to flour mixture. Stir until just combined, fold in blueberries. Spoon into prepared tins, arrange extra banana over batter. Bake for 15 minutes or until cooked.
