Bread Tag Collection

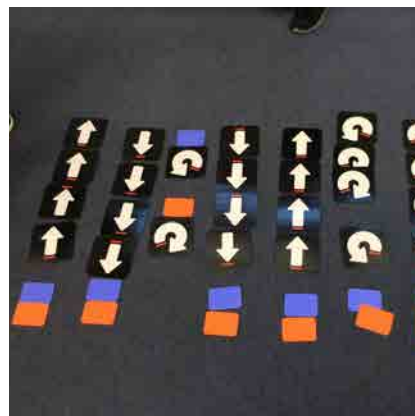
**Your bread tags can provide

SAUSAGE ROLLS



400g sausage mince, 300g chicken mince
1 onion, finely chopped, 1 clove garlic, crushed
1 medium carrot, grated, 1 medium zucchini, grated
1 cup (65g) fresh breadcrumbs, 3 tablespoons chopped parsley, 2 eggs, 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg, salt & freshly ground pepper, 4 sheets frozen puff pastry, semi thawed
1 tablespoon (10g) sesame seeds, Tomato sauce, to serve

Preheat oven to 200°C. Line 2 baking trays with baking paper. Mix both minces, onion, garlic, carrot, zucchini, breadcrumbs and parsley. Beat 1 egg and add to mince mixture. Add nutmeg and seasoning. Divide into 8 equal portions. Cut pastry sheets in half. Place a mince portion down the centre of pastry. Beat remaining egg and brush edges. Roll up to enclose filling, and cut into 6 pieces. Place on trays, seam side down. Brush with egg and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Bake for 20 mins, reduce heat to 180°C, and cook for 10 minutes until golden. Serve with tomato Sauce.
