# **FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Expand: We have purchased new curriculum resources R – 10 to address the expectations of the National Curriculum at a high level. All classrooms have modern technology and students are provided with one to one mobile devices (iPads) to enhance their learning. Grow: Crossways Lutheran School has enormous potential to grow. We have the ability to

teach students in smaller class sizes which benefits student learning. We have been promoting the school vigorously throughout the year and we have gained enrolments. Crossways will have multiple Reception intakes in 2016 which will allow for growth next year.

We want the Ceduna community to realise that Crossways Lutheran School is a safe environment where students can learn and achieve to their ability with the support of a dedicated and committed team of teachers and LSO's. We are here to serve the community as a whole and we strive to ensure that our students become responsible citizens once they leave our school to finish their secondary schooling elsewhere. Some of our students have won scholarships to Immanuel Lutheran College and Pembroke College in Adelaide and we are very proud of them. 




I would like to thank all staff members for their encouragement and support, and my Year 3/4 students for working hard throughout the term.




### SCIENCE





This year has been another fun filled and successful year of learning in Music. Things were a little different this year, with the Receptions having Music lessons as a class on their own, and the Year 5/6/7 class having one lesson per week for the first semester.

Over the course of the year, students have learned about beat, rhythm, dynamics, tempo, pitch and timbre. They have learned to play in unison and accompaniment, to play melodies and drones. They have learned through a variety of activities including movement, speech, dance, singing and playing instruments. The Year 5/6/7 class also explored musical styles from other countries, including Celtic, Reggae and African drumming.

In the July school holidays I took part in a 5 day intensive course in Level 1 of the Orff Schulwerk methodology of teaching music. I have been using this methodology since beginning teaching music, however I wanted to learn more and deepen my knowledge and understanding of it. The days were very long and challenging, but ultimately very rewarding, and provided me with many new resources and skills to use in my teaching. And, of course, my Level 1 Accreditation!

At the beginning of Term 3 we were very fortunate to be able to purchase a bass and an alto xylophone. As the keys are wooden, xylophones have a very different tone to the glockenspiels and metallophones, and the students have benefited greatly from having these two instruments to hear and to play.

Music continues to be a much enjoyed subject for many students. I am often asked "Do we have you for Music today?" when I enter a classroom. For my part, teaching Music to our wonderful, talented students is one of the things I most enjoy doing at school, and I look forward to continuing the Junior School Music program again next year.

Since the beginning of Term 3 I have been visiting Crossways every Wednesday to provide music tutoring for the Middle School Students. Some students have been learning keyboard, others are having singing lessons and some a bit of both! Those learning keyboard include Shantaria Fielding, Caitlyn Milne, Lachlan McIlwraith, Azarni Coleman, Isaiah Coleman, Phillip Miller and Aliera Sansbury. Nyqueela Coleman-Dodd, Joharlea Freeman and Wynona Fielding have been learning to play keyboard and developing new singing skills and Khiara Sansbury has been focusing solely on singing.

All students have shown great enthusiasm to attend their lessons and have come so far in just one semester. Students have been learning about octaves, musical notes (and their location on the keyboard), scales, and both major and minor chords. Learning chords gives the students a great freedom to play the basics of just about any song they like which keeps them interested in playing. Students have suggested the songs they wish to learn and we have been working on them together.

> I have really enjoyed coming to Crossways this year. It is so rewarding to see the progress the students have made in such a short amount of time. For most they have had little musical background and have come from knowing very little to learning how to play entire songs on the keyboard! I encourage them all to stick with it and to endeavor to further their skills in the future.



Their feedback clearly showed my personal story helped them understand a lot more about what else happened during and after WW I and II" She said.



### Guten Tag liebe Leser, good afternoon dear readers.

Students have been enjoying learning about the Die kleine Raupe Nimmersatt (The hungry caterpillar). They learnt a song describing the story and about the different food the caterpillar eats along the way, for example: Apfel (apple), Birnen (pears), Pflaumen (plums), Erdbeeren (strawberries), Apfelsinen (oranges). Students also revised their vocabs in Farben (colour) and Zahlen (numbers) eins bis zehn (one to ten) as well.

Year 3/4 are learning about different Läden (shops) in Germany and their Produkte (produce).

The students' focussed on die Bäckerei (the bakery) and we baked a German Butterkuchen (butter cake) and made Zimtsterne (cinnamon stars) which are typically eaten around Weihnachtszeit (Christmas time). We were baking the Christmas recipes in term 3 because it is Winter in Australia.

The students also made a hot drink called Kinderglühwein (mulled wine) which is a drink for the cold winter in Germany (See the recipes). With Andrew's help, we utilised the kitchen and prepared these typical German winter food, which the students thoroughly enjoyed. Guten Appetit - Mmmm lecker... mmmm yummo!!!

Deutsche Rezepte German recipes

Kinderalühwein Mulled wine (without alcohol of course)



Served warm. Usually made with red wine Ingredients: 4 Cups apple juice, 2 cups of black tea, 1 lemon, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 orange, 1 cinnamon stick, 2 cloves,

Method: Put the apple juice and tea in a saucepan and heat slowly. Peel and juice the lemon and orange. Save the peel. Place the juice, peel, sugar and spices in the pan and continue to cook. Do not boil. Taste and adjust the spices. Strain the mixture through a sieve. Pour in a glass and serve hot.

### Deutscher Butterkuchen German butter cake

Ethan and Kevin are preparing the dough for the Butterkuchen.



Ingredients : 250g Plain Flour, 250g Caster Sugar, 70g Butter, 225ml Cream, 1 Tblespn Baking Powder, 4 Eggs

Topping: 175g Caster Sugar 200g, Flaked Almonds 25g chopped Almonds, 1 Tblespn milk, 175g melted butter Pre-heat oven to 180 degrees. Grease a deep 30 x 20cm rectangular baking dish and dust with flour.

Put the flour, sugar, butter, cream, baking powder and eggs into a large bowl and beat with an electric whisk until combined. Spread evenly in the prepared tin and bake for 15 mins. Do not switch oven off. Meanwhile, make topping. Put sugar, flaked almonds, chopped almonds, milk and 100g of the butter into bowl and combine.

Drizzle remaining butter evenly over cake. Spread topping evenly over the cake then sprinkle with sugar. Return cake to oven and bake for further 15 mins.

### Zimtsterne Cinnamon stars



Ingredients: 2 Egg Whites 175g Icing Sugar 250g ground roasted hazelnuts 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon

Whisk egg whites in bowl until stiff peaks form. Stir in sugar until combined then continue to whisk until thick and glossy. Set aside 40g of the mixture, and then fold the hazelnuts and cinnamon into the remaining mixture to make a very stiff dough. Chill in fridge for about 1 hour. Preheat oven to 140 degrees. Line 2 baking trays with paper. Roll dough into 1cm thickness on workbench heavily dusted with icing sugar. Use a 5cm star shaped cutter to cut shapes. Place biscuits on tray and spread the top of each star with the reserved egg white mixture. Bake in oven for 25 mins. Turn off oven and leave door open but leave biscuits in oven to cool and dry out.
