IMMUNISATION FOR PARENTS OF YEAR 8, 10 & 11 STUDENTS

REMINDER OF NEXT VACCINATIONS AT SCHOOL

Parents /legal guardians are reminded that Community Health Nurses from *Ceduna Community Health Service* will be attending the school on Tuesday 22nd of October 2019, to provide the following scheduled Year 8, 10 and 11 vaccinations.

Since it has been some time since the previous visit, please contact the Community Health Nurses, Elise or Deb on 8626 2156 if there have been any changes to the details previously provided on the Consent Card.

All Year 8 students will be offered:

Dose 2 of the human papillomavirus vaccine, Gardasil®9 (or dose 1 if they have not had already)

All Year 10 students will be offered:

Dose 2 of the meningococcal B vaccine, Bexsero® (or dose 1 if they have not had already)

Single dose of the meningococcal ACWY vaccine, Nimenrix®

Year 11 students will be offered:

Dose 2 of the meningococcal B vaccine, Bexsero® (or dose 1 if has not had already)

Remember to keep your child's School Immunisation Program records in a safe place as they may be required for future employment or travel.

AFSS Stronger Families Targeted Intervention Service

The goal of the Targeted Intervention Service is to keep children safely at home with their family whilst strengthening parenting capacity.



- The Targeted Intervention Service provides culturally safe and sensitive case management support to families so they can address the issues that are placing their children at risk.
- We work with families to build resilience, develop parenting skills and confidence and address barriers which impact on their capacity to safely care for their children.
- We aim for a strong connection to family, community and culture.
- The referral pathways are schools, childcare centers, medical services, agencies or the family can self refer to our program.
- We are a voluntary service and consent must be sought from the family prior to you referring to AFSS.
- We connect families to other services and programs that can help.
- Confidentiality is very important to us and caregivers will be asked to sign an Authority for the Exchange of Information form before any personal information can be disclosed.

Recipe
of the **Week**



200g unsalted butter, 200g caster sugar, 1 egg, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla, 400g plain flour.

Heat oven to 180 degrees and line baking tray with paper.

Beat butter until soft and creamy. Beat in the sugar, then egg and vanilla and finally the flour to make a dough.

Roll dough onto floured surface, approx. half cm thick and cut into biscuit shapes.

Bake for 8-10 mins or until the edges are just brown.
