Year 9/10 Maths & Science

What an exciting time we have had in the Year 9/10 class this term! In Year 9/10 Mathematics, we have been focusing on Algebra and Indices this term. Students have been learning to apply the index laws to numbers, express numbers in scientific notation, find unknown values after substitution into formulas and perform the four operations with simple algebraic fractions. The Year 9/10 students have amazed me with their continuous effort towards their learning and have demonstrated good knowledge, skills and improved confidence in the topics discussed this term. In our Science lessons, we have been learning about the components and sustainability of the ecosystems as well as the natural and human impacts on the ecosystems. Students have conducted a practical activity to investigate the relationship between heat loss and body size in animals. The Year 9/10 students' ability to safely conduct the experiment was very impressive and it was great to see them explore with enthusiasm. Year 9/10 Maths and Science Teacher - Haesil Kim
