Quicksmart Numeracy Program

Middle school tutoring for Term 3 is up and running in the Stem Room. At the end of last term Crossways joined the Quicksmart Numeracy Program, an intervention currently implemented by 1400 Australian schools.

Quicksmart is designed for students from year 5 and above to increase fluency in basic mathematical skills.

Students generally work in pairs and complete a thirty-minute session which includes flash cards, speed sheets, a computer program and a game, all based around a current 'focus set' of number facts.

The program focusses on the four mathematical operations with whole numbers up to and including 12. Research identifies that students who develop fluency and confidence in basic math skills have more cognitive capacity to solve problems in mathematics.

Quicksmart assists students in developing numeracy strategies, for example

Knowledge of DOUBLES and NEAR DOUBLES can assist with addition

4+4 is the same as DOUBLE 4 or

4+5 can be DOUBLE 4 + 1 Or

4+3 can be DOUBLE 4 subtract 1

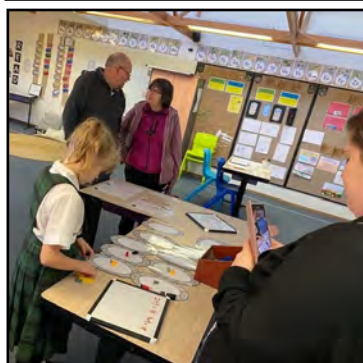
