Principal's Word - Tony Peters



I didn't particularly like going to church as a young child. Much of it didn't make sense and I certainly didn't enjoy the long prayers while standing. I vividly remember one Sunday, when I was about 8 or 9 years old, during one of those long prayer sessions, standing up when there was an almighty crash directly behind us.

An elderly man couldn't stand any longer and just dropped back on to

his seat, allowing the power of gravity to do all the work. My siblings had similar thoughts about church. If it wasn't for Sunday school then I would have thought it was a complete waste of time.

Looking back and reflecting today, I certainly have a very different view. Although church didn't make much sense, certain things were happening that I was completely oblivious to. At the centre of all that was happening, God's word was being shared through the liturgy, hymns, sermons and those long prayers.

As I grew older, things started falling in to place and I began to realise the purpose and reasons behind what happens in church.

In this changing world we live in today, it's comforting to know that I can go to church and experience similar things I did nearly 50 years ago! Why? Because I know that God's love for you and me stays the same, it never changes. God doesn't change because of technology, changing interest rates, because of people's attitude or because of COVID-19. He stays the same, always.

That's a real comfort to me us so we don't need to change to try to 'keep up' with him. The fact is we do change, don't we? We change because of all sorts of things happening in our lives, both good and bad. God is a God of love, who knows our changes and who is ready to give us stability and hope.

At school, during our worship time, members of the school community, including students, parents, staff and visitors have the opportunity to worship in a place where certain rituals remain the same week in week out and some of these rituals have been practiced for centuries in the Lutheran Church. Here in worship, the school community can find solace, peace, stability, comfort and forgiveness provided by God and knowing that he remains unchanged.

With Victorian schools returning to remote learning this week, it is yet another reminder that COVID-19 is still very active in communities. More importantly, it is a reminder that we all have a part to play in helping with halting the spread of the virus. It is very pleasing to see that staff are constantly reminding children to wash their hands at the appropriate times as well as coughing and sneezing in a safe manner. It's also very pleasing to see children doing the right thing So far we have been very fortunate not to have any cases in Ceduna and I hope and pray that we can keep it that way by each of us doing our bit to keep ourselves and others safe.

In two weeks, school photos will take place at the school so it is important that all children attend school on this day wearing the **formal WINTER uniform**. The purpose of a uniform, whether it be in work place or at a school is to do with belonging. We belong to the Crossways community and something, which unifies us, is the wearing of school uniform. It is a visual reminder that we belong to a unique community.

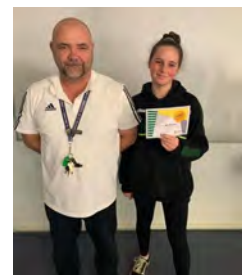

Welcome back to term 3. I trust you all have settled into the term and are enjoying yourselves!

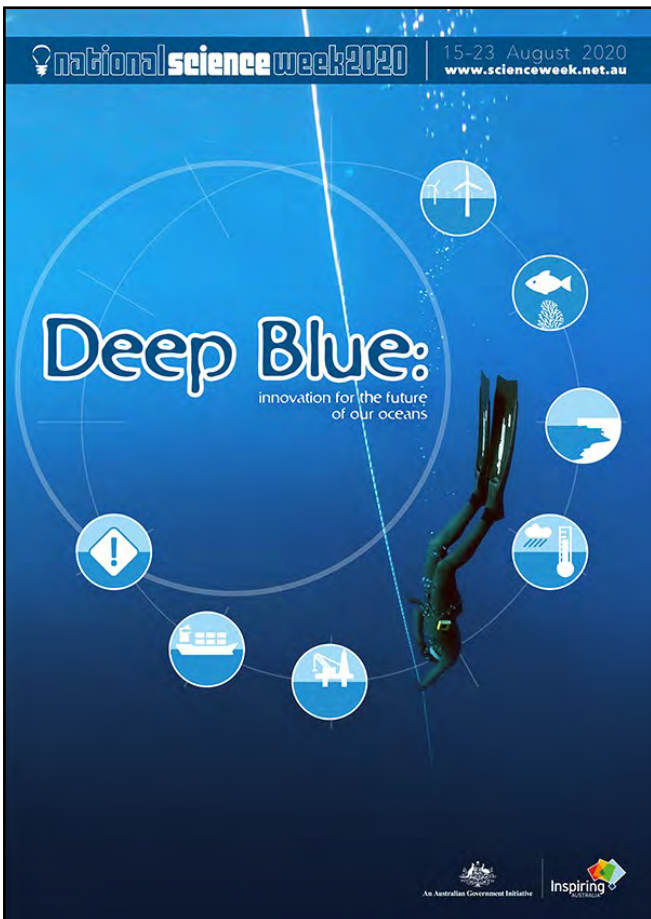
100 Days of School

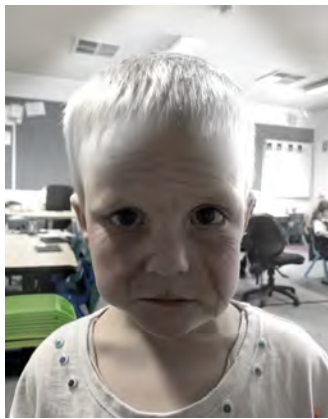
