Principal's Word - Tony Peters



While I was looking through some resources the other day, I came across the small article printed below, 'How to Forgive'. I think it's worthwhile sharing it with you as it highlights the importance of our words and actions around our children, something I have touched on in previous newsletters.

How to Forgive:

Children and adults often have difficulty in admitting their wrongs to others and then apologising. People

prefer to make excuses and blame others for their wrong-doing. The total effect is to increase the conflicts between people. Surely it is far better to acknowledge our wrongs and apologise to one another.

But equally important is the need to forgive one another. This is more than just accepting an apology; this is more than a mere "It's alright!" When people forgive they also restore and rebuild damaged relationships. It is important to teach children how to forgive.

In the Lord's Prayer, Jesus taught us to pray: "Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us." [Luke 11:4]

When we forgive we treat that person as if the wrong never happened. Forgiveness means it is finished – it has been dealt with. There may be some consequences of the wrong-doing, but there is no punishment. That is how God forgives all who trust Him.

As parents forgive their children they are also teaching their children how to forgive others. It is good to say, "I forgive you!" Then work to restore the damaged relationship by not holding any grudge against the person we have forgiven.

Jesus is our teacher here! My prayer is that we all have the courage to forgive from our hearts just as Christ forgives us every day.


