Principal's Word - Tony Peters



During whole assembly last Friday, Margaret Binell was invited to give a talk to the school about her experiences with education. Margaret has a number of grandchildren that are currently going to school.

She gave a personal testimony of what was like for her as a child attending different schools and in summary, even though there were obstacles, it was Margaret's determination which gave her the

strength to complete the course she begun. She spoke of the importance of going to school every day, to learn to read and write and to use mathematical skills.

At Crossways there are many students who come to school every day- last week 58 children from our Junior and Middle school were here 100% of the time. That means 77 students missed at least 1 day of school last week.

This term attendance rates are averaging just over 70% and this is not nearly good enough nor is it acceptable when you look at the reasons why children are not coming to school. Every day your child goes to school, they are learning valuable skills, including academic, social, emotional, physical and spiritual and these are skills they will carry with them into the future.

Each day your child doesn't attend school they miss out much. As a school we are aiming for an average of at least 90% attendance.

If you are parents or guardians of children who are coming to school every day, thank you for encouraging and supporting your child and the school in our endeavour to develop life-long learners.

Over the next couple of weeks, there will be a number of camps happening- the Yr5/6, Yr9/10 and the Yr3/4 camps. We wish Mr Champion and his Year 5/6 class God's blessings as they begin their Aquatics camp out at Penong, the Blue Lake and Pt Sinclair this week, from Wednesday to Friday. The hot weather has passed so they should enjoy much milder conditions for their time away!

Next week we see the Year 9s and 10s head to Adelaide and Kangaroo Island for their week-long camp which I will be participating followed by the Year 3s and 4s who are leaving next Wednesday for their Streaky Bay camp. Let us thank God for our dedicated staff who plan, prepare and attend camps so that children experience a multitude of opportunities to grow and develop. Also thank God that we as a school can offer these types of outdoor educational experiences for all students.

Once again, I'd like to bring to your attention the School's car park- if you are using the car park, please ensure you accompany your child while walking to and from the area. It becomes a very congested area, particularly during peak times i.e. in the morning and in the afternoons, before and after school.

Children should NOT be walking the car park on their own, cars are often reversing to exit the area and this becomes a real hazard when small children are about.

Middle School Maths

This term I have been taking the 7/8 and 9/10 class for maths while Haesil Kim is away on leave. Our main focus has been on 'business maths' and creating mini businesses. The concept is that students have the opportunity to create a product and sell it for a profit. The students wrote letters to Mr Peters and Megan Gillespie asking for a loan of \$100 to get their business started. Students selected their team then decided on a product they felt they could make and hopefully sell for a profit. Some of the students who decided to bake have begun to realise that baked goods cost quite a sum to make and are time consuming. Other teams have created bush medicine soothers and lip balms, and a 9/10 group are making a range of items including baked goods, art and Christmas cards. 50 % of the profits raised will go to a charity of the teams choosing while the other 50% will be shared amongst the team. We have discussed fairness of profit sharing and ensuring each member does their share if they want to receive an equal portion of funds at the end of the term. Students have had to think about advertising to ensure people are aware of what they are selling

It has been great to see how focused and driven a lot of the students are and perhaps we are starting to see our future leaders through this venture.
