

Principal's Word - Tony Peters



Schools are very busy places and no 2 days are ever the same! The other day, there were some staff members who were absent for worthy reasons and so the school still needed to operate without them.

This can present challenges along the way, especially when there are particular skill sets that go with the absenteeism. One of the qualities of our staff is the ability to step in and to step up where there is need.

Though the other day was challenging and staff members needed to do tasks they normally wouldn't, it was obvious they saw a need. Needless to say that I am very appreciative of how staff do their work and what they achieve.

This sort of attitude stems from Crossways' core values based on Christian principles. What I witnessed is living proof that we are walking the talk, that we as a school community are doing exactly what God wants us to do in serving others.

Easter is approaching and this is certainly a time for Christians all over the planet to be reminded of Christ's love for us through the way he served all people. I pray that our example is a light to others around us, especially to the children who attend Crossways so that they too have opportunities to serve others.

There are around 320 community members who have received training with the Restorative Practices including most of the staff from Crossways. There are parents and caregivers of this school who have done the training as well.

The Restorative Practices was an initiative of the Ceduna Services Collaboration Plan where services made up of community members, would focus on a strategy to assist with restoration of relationships. I'd like to provide you with a brief overview of it and to really encourage you to attend a workshop which are available from time to time.

Restorative Practice recognises that the ability to manage relationships is central to lifelong learning and wellbeing. It encourages self-reflection, creates the space to be heard and challenges negative behaviour and its impact on others. This training supports the capacity to build and maintain significant relationships at home, at work, and in the community. In work settings, Restorative Practice ultimately aims to provide workers with explicit practice that can be applied across their work with families and clients regardless of program; and families with consistent and predictable experience of practice across different agencies they may be working with.

So, in the school setting, students and staff are now using restorative strategies and techniques to try and resolve conflict and issues that arise from time to time. This sits very well with who we are at Crossways and what our values are. God's blessings.

IMMUNISATION FOR PARENTS OF YEAR 8 AND YEAR 10 STUDENTS

REMINDER OF NEXT VACCINATIONS AT SCHOOL

Parents /legal guardians are reminded that the Ceduna Community Health Nurses will be attending the school on <u>WEDNESDAY 31 March 2021</u>, to provide the following scheduled vaccines for

Year 8 students:

- 2 doses of the Gardasil 9 (human papillomavirus HPV vaccine) at 2 separate visits
- 1 dose of the diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough vaccine, Boostrix

Year 10 students:

- 2 doses of the Meningococcal B vaccine, Bexsero at 2 separate visits.
- 1 dose of the Meningococcal ACWY vaccine, Niminrex






