Bible readings from last week and again this week have a very strong focus on LOVE. When we closely examine these readings we see that true love comes from God.

Reading 1 John 4: 7-9 we are given some clear insights of love-Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever

does not love does not know God, because God is love. This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him.

What does this *true love* look like? Well, we are told this in the verse. We need to look to the cross to find our greatest example of what true love is all about- Jesus sacrificing his life on the cross for all. And we put him there! Then his last words were "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."

So, what does it look like for us in our daily interactions with one another? If we take Jesus' example we are to lay our lives down for one another but not quite the way Jesus did for us. What God wants us to do is to serve one another without expecting anything in return. And a part of this serving includes forgiving one another just as Jesus forgave us while hanging on the cross. Unless we are hermits, we are constantly living in relationships with one another, and because we are also sinners, things do inevitably go wrong and at times relationships are broken. This is where need to take Jesus' example seriously and work through our broken relationships, to confess and to forgive rather than hanging on to anger, hurt, shame and guilt.

Next week and the week after, students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be participating in NAPLAN (National Assessment Program- Literacy and Numeracy). If you are a parent or carer of a child in one of these year levels, you should have received some detailed information on what this includes. It is important that your child is here at school every day during this time, especially during the morning sessions, so that they can complete all assessment tasks. We wish all these students all the best as they complete the tasks ahead of them!

As you are most likely aware, Tim and Cath Steeles have embarked on a road journey with their children for the remainder of the year. Andrew McIlwraith has taken on Tim's role as the Chaplain and will work closely with students, staff and parents. Relationship building with staff, students and families is an important aspect of this role and we wish Andrew God's blessings as he navigates his way through the various tasks ahead of him.
