Principal's Word - Tony Peters



Last weekend, I attended the Conference of the SA- NT District Synod of the Lutheran Church of Australia. Held in the beautiful Barossa Valley and at the lovely Performing Arts Centre at Faith Lutheran College, Tanunda, these events are opportunities to explore and vote on proposals for our Lutheran Church which ultimately can affect our operations in Lutheran schools. The proposals can involve 'substantial' theological matters such as women's ordination and at times quite trivial issues. Without going in to intimate details of what was discussed and voted on, I was encouraged by our Bishops in Pastor David Altus (SA-NT) and Pastor John Henderson (LCA). They led the way as faithful servants!

There were at times, when delegates spoke, the language they used was less than respectful and Pastor David maintained very much a Gospel approach, modelling how Christ would react in these situations.

During Pastor John Henderson's message based on 1 Peter 3:15, he was able to remind us all that we need to repay evil with blessing; we and the Church are to be a blessing to others; revere Christ as Lord and demonstrate sincere love to all. Pastor John's message based on God's true word wasn't only to those who attended Synod last weekend - it's to all of us! Have a read of the Bible verse:

But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect,

How successful are you at doing this? If you're like me, some times ok and other times quite bad! Pastor John spoke of this verse as a survival guide for us and that the resurrection of Jesus is our living hope; we are to turn to Jesus in all things so that we can at least attempt to relate and reconcile with our neighbour.

Following the Synod Conference, I am in Adelaide visiting some schools and meeting with leaders at the Lutheran Education Office. These are good opportunities to see how other schools in the Lutheran system are operating; in particular, the teaching and learning philosophies and how facilities are designed around them.

Middle School P.E.

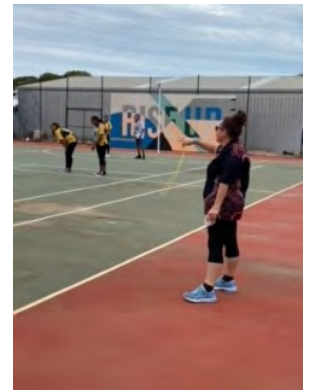
