History of Crossways



The land surrounding Crossways Lutheran School was inhabited by Indigenous people from the Wiringu, Mirning, and Kokatha groups, long before European settlement and descendants of these original inhabitants still live here today.

As early as 1858, farmers saw the potential for producing wool in the Ceduna area. A small settlement sprung up at Denial Bay where the first church in the area was built in 1897 – the Bethlehem Lutheran Church. At the same time, a school was established in the church. At the turn of the century, a mission movement was begun at Koonibba with strong support from the Denial Bay congregation. A church was also built there, followed by a school and a children's home in 1903.

The Denial Bay School continued until 1914 when with the outbreak of World War 1, it was seen as a 'German' school and subsequently closed by the government. Koonibba escaped this treatment as it was seen rather as an Aboriginal school.

In 1980, in response to desire from both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal communities in and around Ceduna, a Lutheran based school investigative committee was set up. The parish council accepted the recommendations of this committee and agreed to establish a school, with an opening date of February, 1983.

On February 7, 1983 the dream came true, a complete staff with classrooms full of children, albeit with builders still on site and working bees operating in the background. Crossways Lutheran School was dedicated on June 5, 1983, with five classrooms and 111 children.

In 1996, parents encouraged the school council to consider the move towards developing a Middle School to cover Year 6 to Year 9. In 2005, the Middle School also included learning for students to Year 10. In 2008, there were about 160 children in the school who were Indigenous and non–Indigenous.

Today, the student population is predominantly an Indigenous one. Many changes have taken place at the school over the past ten years including a new building extension in the Junior School along with an undercover canopy

area. None of the changes across time have altered the goal of the school which is to provide an excellent

education in a Christ-centred community.

In all things, the gospel of Jesus Christ will continue to inform all that we do at Crossways.

ENROLMENTPolicy

Crossways Lutheran School is an ELC to Year 10 co-educational day school. We offer a Christian based education to all applicants regardless of ethnic origin, gender, religion or disability provided that:

- Application for Enrolment:
 Parents seeking enrolment for their child/
 children undertake to support the stated
 values of Crossways Lutheran School.
- At Crossways we grow our students holistically: "body mind and soul"
- In the case of more applications than enrolment places, preferences will be given to siblings of children already enrolled at the school and children of practising Lutheran families.



Enrolment priorities will be determined from time to time by Crossways Lutheran School Council. The current enrolment priorities are children of:

- 1 Lutheran parents with brothers and sisters at the school.
- 2 Non-Lutheran parents with brothers and sisters at the school.
- 3 Communicant members of the Parish.
- 4 Other Christians non Lutheran.
- **S** Other people with a desire for a Christian education.





Multiple Intake Program

BIRTHDAY DATES

Beginning Term 1 Turn 5 before 1st May

Beginning Term 2 Turn 5 before 31st July

Beginning Term 3 (mid year intake)

Turn 5 before 30th Sept

Student progression to the next year level will be solely determined by school. Mid-year intake students will spend 18 months in Reception. Progression to Year 1 will be determined by the Reception teachers and Junior School Coordinator.





Transition from Kindergarten / Home to School

Pre-enrolment enquiries are welcome and the Principal is available to provide a tour of the School and answer any of your enrolment questions (please make an appointment). Children are offered the chance to take part in a Transition Program prior to starting school. A parent orientation visit with the Principal is also organised to coincide with the Transition Program.

Confirmation of Enrolment

Enrolment applications must be completed, returned to Crossways and an interview time arranged with the Principal.

Parents/guardians sign the 'Offer of Enrolment letter' after they have read the attached school aims/values statement and policies. By signing the copy of the letter, parents/caregivers and children agree to support the school and abide by school expectations.

An appropriate school start day will then be arranged. From time to time, an enrolment may be accepted or declined at the discretion of the Principal when deemed in the best interests of the child.



Student Progress, assessment and reporting



Crossways Lutheran School recognises the importance of integrating all guidance practices which will make student progress and adjustment more effective. Standardised achievement tests help to determine student, class and teaching strengths and subsequent areas of improvement.

The Independent Schools Association (AISSA) – Special Education Unit also helps in specialised areas to assist Crossways to adjust teaching procedures and practices. Crossways has adopted ongoing assessment procedures.

Junior School (R-4) assessment portfolios are sent home at the end of Term 2 and 4. These contain student work samples and teacher assessments.

Parent/teacher interviews are conducted twice a year. Additional interviews can be requested by either parents or teachers. A constant link between home and school constitutes one of the strengths of the Lutheran School system.

Crossways encourages parents to make initial communication through the home class teacher.


Diary/Communication Book

All students will have diaries/communication books in which all homework and minor notices to parents can be written. Parents should also use the diary/communication book as an effective means of communication, explaining absences and unusual circumstances or situations to the teacher.

Newsletter and Website

Crossways Newsletter is issued fortnightly in hard copy to the student or electronically via email. Other notices are sent home from time to time, but this will be kept to an absolute minimum. e.g. book club, excursions etc. It is expected that any notification for excursions will be sent out at least three weeks prior to the excursion.



At Crossways Early Learning Centre your child will embark on an amazing journey towards school. The Early Years are a vital step in a child's education. We aim to make it positive, productive and as successful as possible, so that your child will confidently grow into the larger school community that is Crossways Lutheran School!

A Day in the ELC: Monday to Thursday from 8:30am – 4:00pm during school terms. Children are enrolled for a maximum of 2 days per week or 4 sessions (am/pm) equivalent to 15 hours/ week. The service is open 40 weeks per year.

* To start in the ELC at the beginning of the year (Term 1), your child must turn 4 on or before the 1st May of that year to begin their ELC journey.
