

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

Teachers aim to use ICT to enhance our lessons and engage our students so that they can learn the skills necessary to be successful in the community. We also aim to teach students the skills needed to navigate various hardware devices such as laptops and iPads and their software programs.

It has been great to see our STEM Room being used by many classes and the Junior

School developing their understanding of how to use laptops. In the Year 3 class we have been learning how to log on, use Microsoft Word and PowerPoint and save our documents.
