During our devotional time this week, we are looking at the wonderful book of Proverbs and in particular, from chapter 22 verse 9 which says:

Sports Captain Polo's have arrived at School and are available for House Captains to purchase from the front office for \$15.





It has been wonderful seeing the time and effort the students have put into their pieces and some students created more than one.


This is one of the many ways our students give back to their school by creating beautiful artworks that are displayed for many years to come.
