Principal's Word - Tony Peters



The **power of the tongue** is our focus for devotion this week. God's word from James 3: 7-10 tells us that...

'All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and sea creatures are being tamed and have been tamed by mankind, but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made

in God's likeness. Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be.'

This is telling us that as humans we have the capability and ability to do great things, but we also have the capacity to do much harm to fellow human beings by just opening our mouth. God is calling us to be careful and to use much wisdom when we speak so that our relationships can be positive and respectful. When things go wrong and they do from time to time, it's important that we also have the courage to reconcile with the person we have offended. This means we say sorry and ask for forgiveness. This is exactly what God wants us to do because he wants our relationships with one another to be progressive, tolerant, accepting and understanding.

We need to be always be on the alert and check in - sometimes our mouth works quicker than our brain and we end up saying things which can cause grief to others. And this can easily happen especially if we are under pressure, stressed or simply not thinking! So it's important we pause for a moment and think how we may respond in situations which can determine whether our relationships are positive or not.

I pray that God keeps us in check with the use of our tongue so that we develop and strengthen relationships so that our children have good role models

By the time you receive this newsletter, I will be accompanying the Year 4 class on their school camp at Coodlie Park near Port Kenny. I'm amazed at the level of excitement and the expectations that school camps bring to children and the Year 4 class are no exception and have been talking about this camp for a few weeks now. I know that I've said this previously, but school camps have a myriad of benefits for children and probably the most important of them is the development of independency and team work. On camp, children are away from home, away from the people that normally look after them at home. To a certain extent children are learning to look after themselves for a few days and one day they will grow into adults and leave home for good so school camps are good practice. Due to the nature of school camps, where there is a group of children together, it is an opportune time for the development of team skills and getting along with one another- these are vital life skills. I'm looking forward to sharing with you the experiences the students of the Year 4 class will have on their camp this year!



Sports Captain Polo's have arrived at School and are available for House Captains to purchase from the front office for \$15.

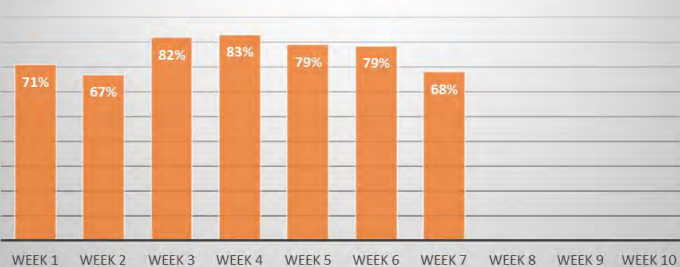

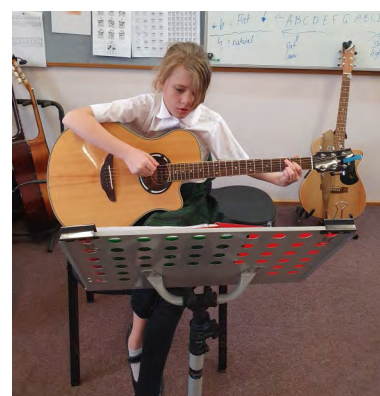
Elective - Band
