Easter

This week we've been investigating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem – Palm Sunday.

This part of the Easter Story reveals much about Jesus' character. He was considered a King but comes in to Jerusalem on a donkey and not on a chariot driven by horses. When we consider where Jesus was born, we learn of a similar refrain where the promised Messiah was born in a stable.

Easter tells us much about who Jesus is – a most humble person. God wants us to know that Jesus is for all people and that he is accessible to everyone. This comes to an absolute peak when Jesus is on the cross, crucified and left for dead when he says to his Father, "Forgive them, for they do not know what they're doing."

This is Jesus. Humble, forgiving, selfless and loving. And he wants us to be like Him. I provide the verse from Ephesians 5:1-2

Watch what God does and then you do it, like children who learn proper behaviour from their parents. Mostly what God does is love you. Keep company with him and learn a life of love. Observe how Christ loved us. His love was not cautious but extravagant. He didn't love in order to get something from us but to give everything of himself to us. Love like that.

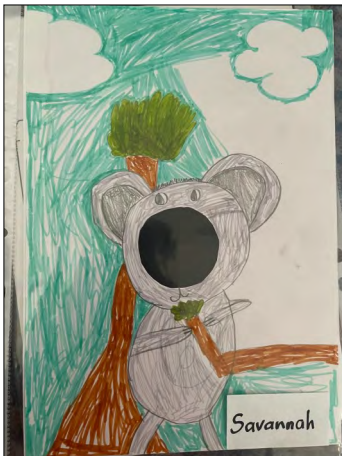
