## Principal's Word - Tony Peters



**Free, to love**

**Galatians 3:24-25**

*The law was our guardian until Christ came; it protected us until we could be made right with God through faith. And now that the way of faith has come, we no longer need the law as our guardian.*

Martin Luther was instrumental in helping the early Church understand what God's love really meant. In the early 1500s, he spent countless hours reading God's word, searching for evidence that to be saved is a free gift from God.

Luther taught that salvation and, consequently, eternal life are not earned by doing good things but are received only as the free gift of God's grace through the believer's faith in Jesus Christ. He thoroughly opposed the Roman Catholic belief that one needed to pay for their wrong doing.

Luther came to understand justification as entirely the work of God. Luther states "That is why faith alone makes someone just and fulfills the law...Faith is that which brings the Holy Spirit through the merits of Christ."

This brought about the 'Reformation' of the Church and the Christian Church as we know it today. With this unconditional love from God, meaning we don't owe anything when things do go wrong, we are free to love others. For most people, this is a radical conviction because we are wired to punish, to get revenge to those who do wrong; there must be a consequence.

So, we must look to Christ and learn what he did for all people, without any conditions attached. Christ needs to be the one we turn to for strength and courage to love and serve others.

### Capital Grants

During the last 12 months a number of projects have been completed which have been made possible with the assistance of State Government Capital Grants. Below is a list of projects which have been completed during this financial year-

- Installation of 2 outdoor spaces which allow for staff and student seating and restoration circles
- Paving of area of front gate to ELC. Concrete ramp from footpath to the path
- Removing and replacing retainer wall and steps adjacent to the carpark
- Removing and replacing 276m of the western boundary fence
- Installation of audio streaming system across the school

We sincerely thank the assistance from the State Government who have provided funds this financial year so that Crossways is able to continue to improve, develop and enhance the School learning environment in various ways.

### Palya Bike Program

During this week, the Palya Bike Program was implemented across the School. This program allows students to develop their knowledge and understanding of bicycles, bike safety, bike maintenance etc. It was great to see some students bring along their own bikes to the program and hopefully this may encourage more children to ride to school!

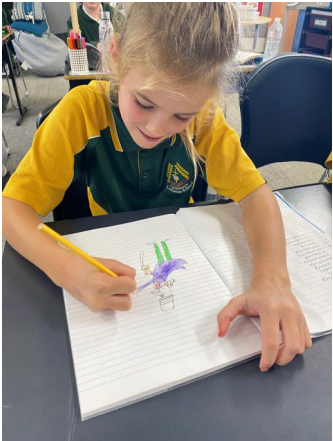


## Year 5 Class News

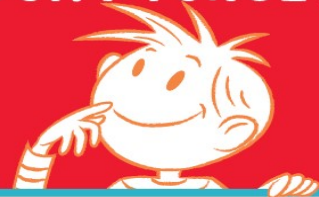
