Owning nothing

Jesus said, "None of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

(Luke 14:33)

What do you think when you reflect on this verse? How do you interpret it? This week, during morning devotion, the staff had the opportunity to do some reflecting on-What possessions would we find difficult to give up?

What possessions could we do without?

It was a very interesting exercise in that we were all trying to evaluate what was really important to us. Something which was highlighted was the importance of loved ones in our lives- family and friends. Everyone needs to be loved and to love others. God has put other people in our lives for this love to be an example of his love.

This word of God, I think, is meant to remind us that nothing should come between us and God. That we put God above everything else and I don't think it means we give up the things we love. The good news is that a massive part of God's love is his ability to still love us through the struggles we may find ourselves in. His love is unconditional and that's something we can own!

Much like term 2, this term we have experienced sporadic students' attendance which has made consistency with the learning delivered difficult.

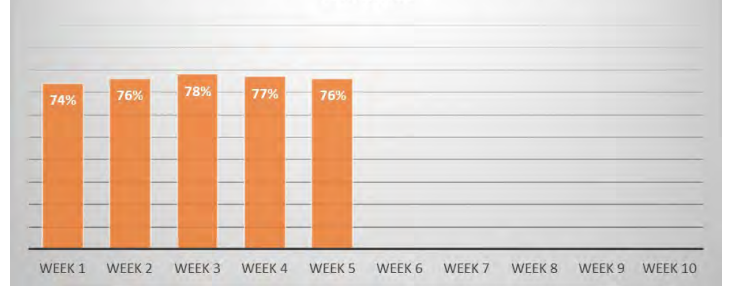
Although, this showed how strong and supportive our community is, we have been able to slowly overcome these adversities and settle back our classroom routines and programs. The senior class has done a great job at

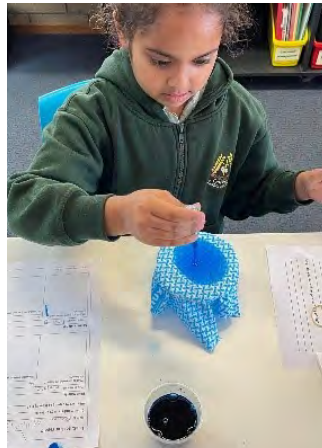
Year 3/4 - Mr Donald

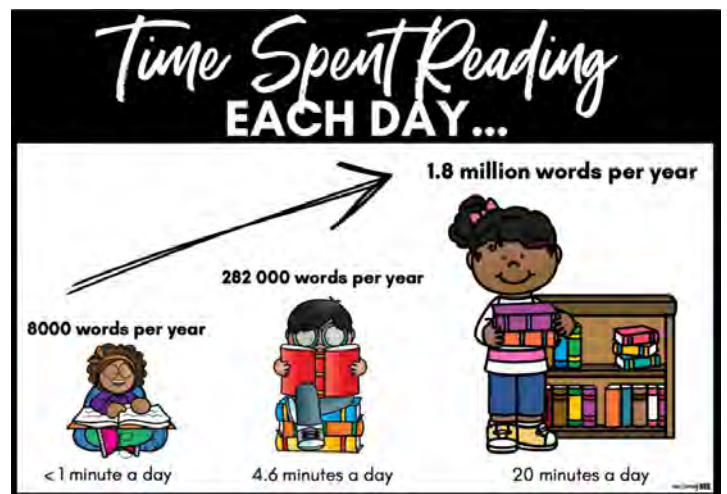
non-fiction books can expose children to a range of new words, text types and book structure. Some questions or conversations you could have with your child when reading include:
