Clean

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. (Psalm 51:10)

As we explored this text, teaching staff, during our morning devotional time this week were given quotes, some from God's word, which reflected on **forgiveness**. Here are some:

"Forgive them even if they're not sorry"

"Forgive others, not because they deserve forgiveness, but because you deserve peace" (Mel Robbins)

"Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you" (Colossians 3:13)

The notion of forgiveness invariably has different meaning for individuals but when we explore the text from Psalm 51:10 (listed above), we are informed that forgiving someone changes something within us. If we hold something against someone, how is it we can be free or how can we be at peace?

Forgiving someone is a gift and we do need to look to Christ continually because he has set the bar when he hung on that cross and cried out in his last moments,

For your child, opportunities include –

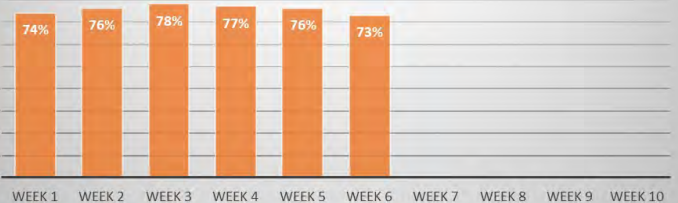
- Sharing their learning journey with parents/carers

- Bottles of Drink (non-alc)

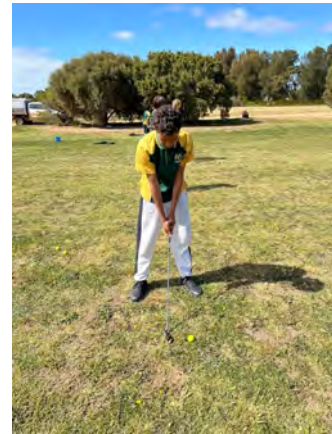
PLEASE—only donate new item or “as new” items with the exception of using upcycled clean jars to fill with lollies and treats etc.
