Snake Safety at School

Warmer weather is here and you may have already seen reptiles getting about. I encountered a brown snake at my place recently and it reminded me of how important it is to follow safe processes when we do encounter a snake, especially when we are at School! The School has a snake safety policy which is shared with the school community in various formats, including Whole School Assembly, Newsletters and on the School's Website. Last week I shared the following information to staff and students at Assembly: When you see a snake:

- 1. Assume it is poisonous. Do not approach it.
- 2. Stay calm.
- 3. Tell nearby people to stay away. Get someone to tell a teacher.
- 4. At least 1 more staff member is called to assist.
- 5. Area must be clear of children and other adults.

The Snake Safety process will continue in next week's newsletter.
