God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. (Psalm 46: 1)
Have you ever wondered where God is when disaster strikes? This question along with many others are the type we may ask when things aren't going so well.

If we take the recent floods which are hitting many communities in the eastern parts of Australia as an example, I'm pretty sure some people are wondering if there is a God, and why would he allow this type of event to happen. There are

Snake Safety at School

I encountered a brown snake at my place recently and it reminded me of how important it is to follow safe processes when we do encounter a snake, especially when we are at School! The School has a snake safety policy which is shared with the school community in various formats, including Whole School Assembly, Newsletters and on the School's Website. Last week I shared the following information to staff and students at Assembly:

When you see a snake:

1. Assume it is poisonous. Do not approach it.
2. Stay calm.
3. Tell nearby people to stay away. Get someone to tell a teacher.
4. At least 1 more staff member is called to assist.
5. Area must be clear of children and other adults.

The Snake Safety process will continue in next week's newsletter.
