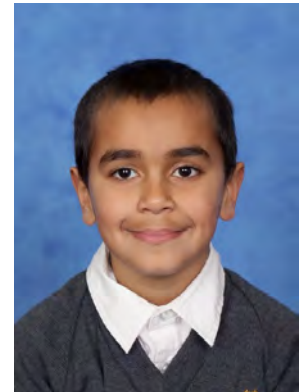

On Tuesday this week Mr Borgas took a selection of Middle School students to Streaky Bay to participate in an Interschool Basketball carnival.

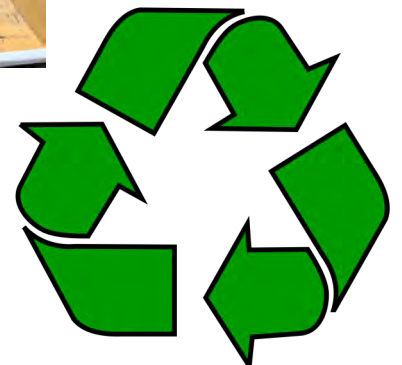
Up-Cycled Art

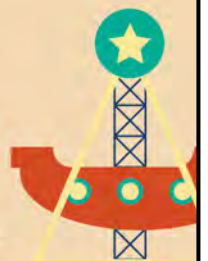
