
Carnival of the Arts

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
GGSA Maths - Mr Caretti

We are into our fourth term of our new Good to Great Schools Maths program. Last term our groupings across the school changed, due to retesting at the end of term 2, which saw a great improvement in numeracy growth across many year levels, we have continued to see this term. We are starting to see the fruits of the program, through consistent

improvement through the Mastery Test data results. Also, it is exciting to see when observing groups, the consistency in classroom expectations, structures and routines being implemented in these Maths groups. It is evident that

students have really benefited from a consistent approach, resulting in a rise of engagement and effort levels in students. This term we participated in our annual Acer PAT testing across our school. PAT-M is a test, that results in assessment data which allows us to identify starting points for learning, target teaching and monitor growth. Specifically, this year we were able to conduct the test with a higher percentage of our student cohort than 2021, which has been valuable in seeing greater depth in whole school data. We are still catching up students that were absent when testing, although it is already very pleasing to see that already our whole school data is showing an overall higher achievement in individual students results than previous years.

Looking forward to 2023, we are continuing our work with the implementation of Good to Great School Programs. It is anticipated that the 'Spelling Mastery' program will be implemented across the School. Like GGSA Maths, Spelling Mastery is a research-proven program that uses the evidence-based Direct Instruction method to enable instructors to deliver highly interactive, structured lessons that help students learn dependable spelling skills. Many schools use the program, and ones that I have spoken with directly have been amazed with the benefits and improvements in students spelling and writing in result of the program. It is also anticipated some classes will deliver a trial pilot program for GGSA Oz-e-Science Program, an explicit instruction pedagogy with 'I do, we do, you do' embedded in every lesson. Oz-e-science maps the Australian Curriculum extensively down to each lesson. Students will engage in a student rich, balanced, hands-on, and flexible Science curriculum. Lastly, I am excited to continue in my role as Crossways GGSA instruction Coach Coordinator next year, and look forward to being apart of the development and improvement in our students learning abilities and opportunities.




