
We can look to the promise that God gave Joshua and know that he is with us through both the good and bad times.



Starting in a new school (or starting school for the first time) can be tricky, particularly for our neuro-divergent students. Our Learning Support team work hard to try to help these students settle in and to be successful in and outside the classroom.

Working closely with me this year are -

Lois Haynes

Lois tutors students primarily in speech/articulation and reading/literacy, however she also works with students who need fine motor skill development (essential for handwriting), or tutoring in Maths. Her focus area is the Year F-2 cohort, as the earlier we can offer intervention the better the outcomes. Lois' list is often long, and we try to prioritise students according to their needs.

Sam, Nicki and Winston work as Learning Support
Officers alongside individual students with disabilities in
the classroom who need help to successfully
navigate the demands of school. They are essential
members of the team, as they are the ones working
directly with these students every day.

However, student support is really everybody's business.

You will find (if you don't know already!) that I am a strong advocate for the rights of students with disabilities and for Inclusive Practice in our schools. I work hard to ensure wherever possible that students with disabilities are receiving the supports they need to be successful at school. The Department for Education, Catholic Education South Australia and the Association of Independent Schools of South Australia have all endorsed the following principles for inclusion:

- All children and students who experience disability have the right to access and participate in education.
- All children and students who experience disability have the ability to learn and the right to exercise their voice, choice and control in managing their own educational experiences.
- All children and students who experience disability have the right to develop to their fullest potential and to be active, valued citizens in the community.
- Teachers, early childhood education and care centre and school communities and the parents/carers/advocates of children and students who experience disability have the responsibility for taking action for inclusive behaviour in their education and care setting.
- All children and students who experience disability have the right to an appropriate and adequate allocation of resources to enable their right to access and participate meaningfully in education.
- All children and students who experience disability, their parents/carers/advocates, teachers and members of the early childhood education and care centre and school communities have the right to be safe physically, emotionally, culturally and socially and to be treated respectfully.
- All children and students who experience disability, their parents/carers/advocates, teachers and members of the school community have the responsibility to operate within the legal framework provided by the Australian and South Australian governments.

The Disability Standards for Education require educators, students, parents and other associates to work together so that students with disability can participate in education. If you would like to know more about the standards you can find it here: https://www.nccd.edu.au/
