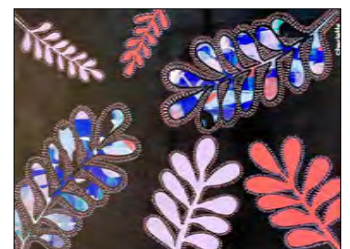

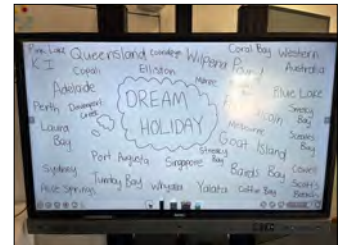
Year 3/4 Donald

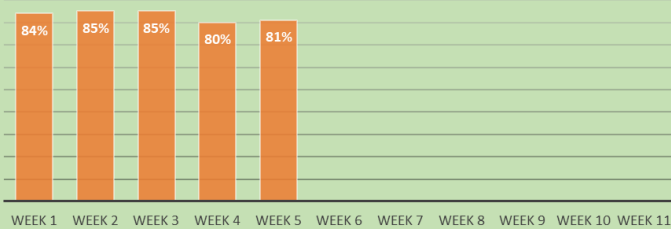
