Ways to help

Luke 10:33-34

"But a Samaritan, as he travelled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him."

This story is one of the most well-known stories of the Bible, with the term being a "Good Samaritan" being understood to some extent by most of society. But, did you know that there is a "Good Samaritan" law in Australia and in America there is a "Good Samaritan Act" which was passed by the United States Congress?

In Australia the "Good Samaritan" law was put in place to protect people from prosecution who give emergency assistance to someone in need. *'Australian states and territories have in place Good Samaritan legislation to ensure that people who step forward to provide emergency medical assistance are not held legally liable for their actions, provided they acted in good faith'.*

At times we may wonder how relevant the teachings of the Bible are for today's world. Certainly, many things have changed since the days when the Bible was written, and we live in a society which is far removed from those times. However, the teachings of Jesus, and his messages around caring for others are just as relevant today as they were back then. At Crossways we care for our students by not only give our students a great education, but also endeavouring to support their growth emotionally, physically, socially and spiritually.

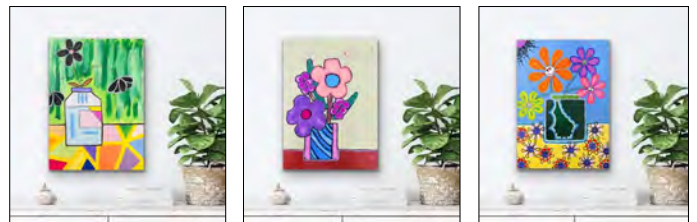

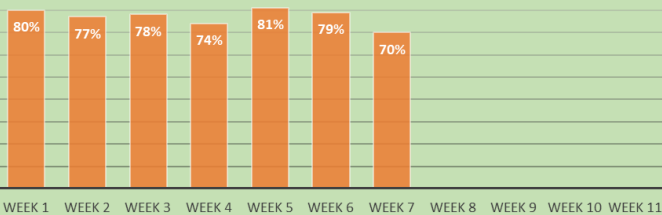
