Over the break I was lucky enough to spend some time in Darwin before completing a 3 day Crisis Prevention safety intervention training. Derani Hoffrichter, Greg Miller and myself spend 3 days heavily immersed in this training so that we could become the trainers for our school. Needless to say it was full on and certainly put us all under pressure to ensure we learnt the

connect in the short time and felt comfortable to teach it to our staff at some stage this year. What is CPI Safety Intervention training? It is a safe, nonharmful behaviour management system designed to help professionals in any setting provide the best possible Care, Welfare, Safety and Security of individuals presenting a range of crisis behaviours. We learnt about the Crisis Development Model and ways to identify Anxiety, Defensive Behaviours, Risk Behaviours and Tension Reduction along with how staff should approach each stage through in a supportive way. (This I found to be a very beneficial part of the course.) We also learnt a range of safe ways to redirect students if need be.

I was also fortunate enough to spend some time exploring aspects of the Darwin region and soaking up the sunshine!

I hope all our families and students had some quality time together and are ready for another busy term!
