Matthew 11: 28-29

Life is busy and it is all too easy to take on too much and at times we can suffer from burnout. Burnout can be caused by too much stress over a long period of time and signs of burnout may include:

- feeling exhausted and unable to perform basic tasks
- losing motivation in many aspects of

- your life, including your work and friendships
- feeling unable to focus or concentrate on tasks
- feeling empty or lacking in emotion
- losing your passion and drive
- experiencing conflict in your relationships with co-workers, friends and family
- withdrawing emotionally from friends and family.

John Wesley was a respected Christian leader who helped start the Methodist Church spoke about the "business" of his life. *"Though I am always in haste, I am never in a hurry, because I never undertake more work than I can go through with a calmness of spirit".*

Why do we rush through life thinking everything depends on us? Do we take on more responsibilities than we should? A word which is not common anymore is "yoke". A yoke is a wooden beam that is fastened over the necks of two animals and attached to the plough or cart that they are pulling and shares the load between the two.

This week in our devotion we have been focusing on what Jesus said in Matthew 11: 28-29, *"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. 


New Junior School Play Equipment


