This week we have continued celebrating book week with our Book Fair, and it was great to see so many staff and students attending our Tuesday night BBQ, participating in activities, and of course buying books.

It got me thinking about books that I have enjoyed over the years, of waiting for the release of a new book

from a favourite author and riding my bike to the local library to look for new reads. I also thought about a book that along with many others, I read every day — the Bible. What an amazing book it is. I looked up some facts about the Bible and came up with some interesting facts.

Originally, the books in the Bible didn't have chapters or verses – they were added later. Chapters were introduced in A.D. 1238 by Cardinal Hugo de S. Caro, while the verse notations were added in A.D. 1551 by Robertus Stephanus. There are 66 books in the King James Bible, containing 1,189 chapters, 31,102 verses and 783,137 words.

According to Guinness World Records, the Bible is the best-selling book of all time with an estimated 5 billion copies sold & distributed, and statistics from Wycliffe International, Gideons International, and the International Bible Society indicate that the number of new Bibles that are sold, given away, or otherwise distributed in the United States is about 168,000 per day.

From the 32,102 verses in the Bible, the one we are focusing on this week is Jerimiah 29:11. For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.

This verse encourages us, letting us know that the Lord has plans to prosper us, to give us hope and give us a future.

Those of us who are facing difficult situations today can take comfort in Jeremiah 29:11 knowing that though it is not a promise to immediately rescue us from hardship or suffering, it is a promise that God has a plan for our lives and regardless of our current situation, He can work through it to prosper us and give us a hope and a future.
