The entrance to Crossways Lutheran School is quite striking, featuring lovely gardens and several Metal Art Sculptures. In the centre as you drive in there are three sculptures together. Have you noticed what is on them?

On October 31st each year, Christians around the world celebrate "Reformation Day", this day is of particular importance

for Crossways as we are a Lutheran School.

"Reformation Day" celebrates the day 506 years ago on October 31, 1517 that Martin Luther, an Augustine monk, nailed Ninety-Five Theses to the door of a Church in Wittenberg, Germany. These theses provoked a debate that culminated in what we now call the Protestant Reformation.

The debate and resulting reformation were important for many reasons, not the least being a refocusing on the Grace of God. "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." Ephesians 2:8 – 10

Grace means undeserved generosity, first received from God, then freely given to others. When we practice grace, we honour and accept others, creating an inclusive school community.

Next time you drive in to Crossways you may notice the Metal Art Sculpture commemorating the 500th Anniversary of Reformation Day, and perhaps you will have a greater understanding of its significance.


