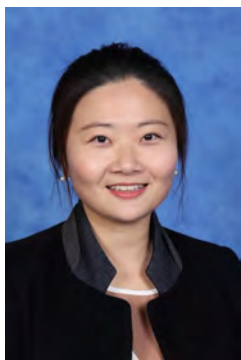

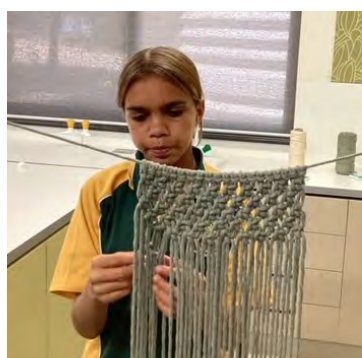
Middle School Electives

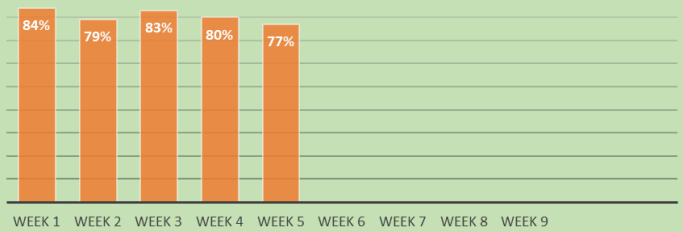
