



Students can read books and then attempt to answer questions about those books to show their understanding of what they have read.

#### Amber Drummond—Learning Support



Welcome to Term 2! Another big term ahead of us, but we're excited for everything the term brings. In the Alternative Learning Program we are covering STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths), Art, Zones of Regulation and Cooking.

In STEM we are learning about how materials change. We are experimenting with materials and having fun making slime, growing rainbows and

other chemical reactions. In Art we are learning about portraits. We will be exploring a range of artists, and using different techniques and art mediums to make a range of different portrait styles.

#### MacqLit at Crossways

#### What is MacqLit?

MacqLit is a reading program for children in Year 3 and above who need some help with their reading. It usually takes place in groups of four to six students. Students will be working with a teacher or LSO outside of the classroom four times a week. Each session will last for 45 minutes. MacgLit has been developed by MultiLit, a research-based initiative of Macquarie University. MultiLit has been producing reading programs for over 20 years.

#### What is involved in MacgLit?

Teachers or trained LSO's work with small groups for up to an hour a day, four or five times a week, using the carefully structured MacqLit materials. The program will teach your child how to read and spell words using appropriate strategies. As well as doing the one-hour MacqLit lessons, students need to get plenty of opportunities to practise the skills they are learning. They do this by reading one-to-one with a teacher/LSO several times a week.

#### How do I know the program is effective?

Many decades of research into reading have shown teachers how best to teach reading. MacqLit uses these research-based teaching methods. The teacher delivering MacqLit will be closely monitoring your child's progress through regular short progress monitoring activities as well as through more formal testing. Our goal is to support your child to be reading with more independence and with greater accuracy and fluency.

#### How can I help my child?

Although MacqLit can only be used in schools by specially trained teachers and classroom assistants, parents can help their child by listening to them read several times a week at home.

In Zones of Regulation we will be learning about emotions and strategies to regulate our bodies. We will create a toolkit or strategies to help us and learn about check-in's throughout the day, to monitor our emotions.

In Cooking we will be continuing our lunch snacks. We will be making a range of items that the students can include in their lunch boxes.

An exciting term ahead with lots of learning and development to be undertaken by the Learning Support Team. I look forward to sharing some of our activities and learning in coming weeks.


